FVLC SERVICES DURING COVID-19

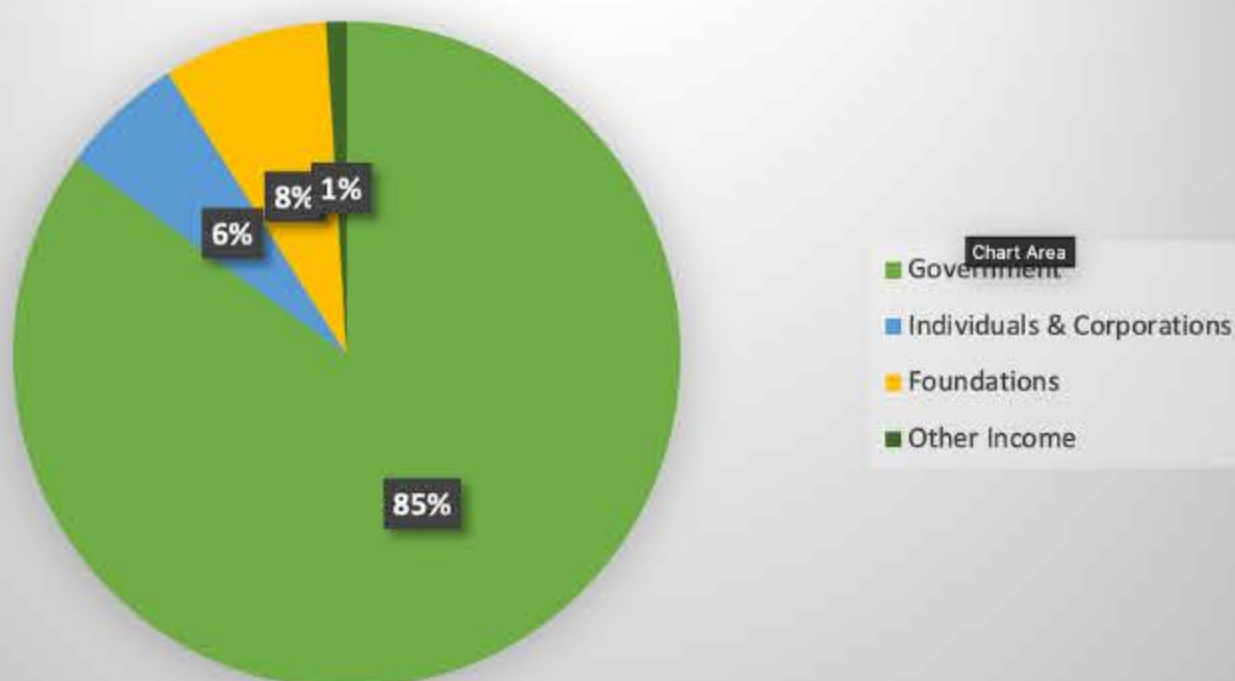
FVLC continued to provide most services remotely, while responding as needed in person to survivors in crisis

between May and July 2021, we saw a 157% increase in new requests for legal services

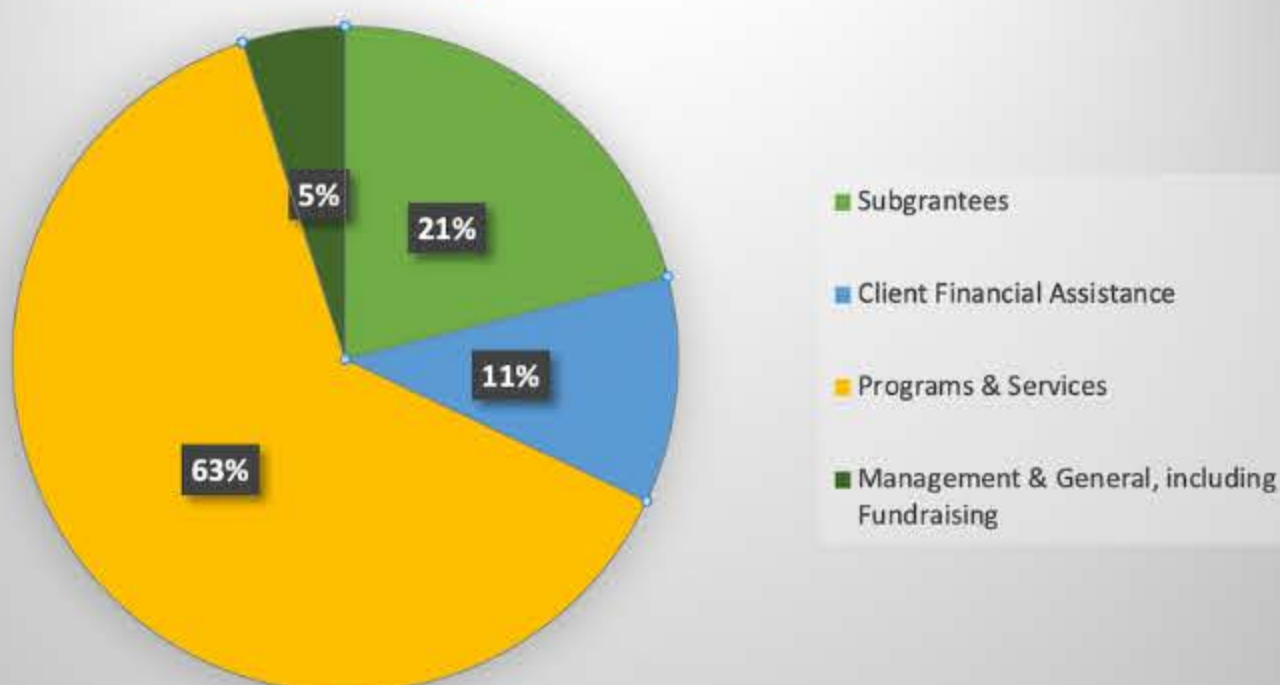
the levels of violence reported by survivors remained severe and survivors continued to experience economic distress
